## Concert to showcase faith music in Tucson

If you think “faith music” is just organs and hymns, you might want to check out the upcoming “Music for the Soul” concert.

More than 100 performers, representing a wide range of faiths and cultures, will take part in this year’s interfaith concert, scheduled for Thursday, Nov. 6, at 7 p.m. at the Fox Tucson Theatre.

It’s fairly safe to say that this is one of the few concerts you’ll see where a Jewish Klezmer band will appear on the same stage as a Buddhist chant group, Christian liturgical dancers, a Latina mariachi performer, and a Muslim Imam.

Performers also will include a classical guitarist and flute player representing Yaqui and Navajo faith traditions; a hand-bell choir; a women’s chorus; an African Christian choir; and a member of the Tucson City Council who is a countertenor/baritone soloist.

For the fourth year, the event will be sponsored by Interfaith Community Services, a volunteer-based nonprofit in Tucson. Proceeds will benefit ICS programs for seniors, the disabled and the disadvantaged in Pima County.

“We’re thrilled with the diverse group of performers scheduled for this year’s concert,” said Monnie Applegate, Development Director for ICS. “Our goal is to show how the music of our different faiths can bring us together as a community.”
